
Overview

Monarch has been using the Kiva.org platform to assist in making micro loans available to entrepreneurs from around the world.

Kiva helps individuals and groups to provide micro-loans in developing countries with the intention of empowering individual entrepreneurs. Loan amounts that we direct to a recipient is fully passed on to them without any deduction from our intended loan amount. Kiva is funded solely by voluntary donations as separate contributions. Kiva loans have an impressive repayment rate of approximately 97%.

Some Monarch Loan Stories



Imran
Pakistan

Imran is a 39-year-old man who established a low-cost private school. There are 143 students enrolled in the school, and 47% of them are female students. In his school, female education is encouraged. It is important to have educated women. The school aims to have forward-looking strategies, and therefore Imran has planned to conduct teacher training in the near future. He also wishes to get the building of his school repaired, but the repair and maintenance cost will be quite high. He has requested an amount of PKR. 200,000 for getting the school building repaired.



Sang
Cambodia

Sang is a thirty-seven year-old widowed mother of three children. She is a construction worker. Two of her children are students. She lives in the Kracheh Province of Cambodia. She earns a net profit of around 9 USD each day. She is moving ahead to improve her family's standard of living. Due to financial difficulties, she is asking for a loan to buy a motorcycle for her family's daily use. She hopes that this loan will help her to reduce her family's expenses. In the future, she wants to build a house and send her children to college.



Adelaide
Ghana

Adelaide is forty-four years old. She is married and has three children who are all still in school. She lives with her husband and children in a rented apartment in a community where the major occupation is trading. Adelaide works very hard to support her husband to be able to provide for the family. She runs a provision store by the roadside in her community, procuring her goods from Accra. Adelaide has been in business for some years and wants a loan to buy provisions in bulk to increase her stock.

Success Stories


Kiva Life is a function we can see through our account that gives us updates on our previous borrowers. Kiva sends people into the field to journal progress and report back to lenders. One of our lenders, Imran, has a school in Pakistan. With our help and that of many others, he was able to purchase a water cooler, a generator and a new toilet. He expressed sincere thanks to us all.

Highlights and Statistics

To date, Monarch has made 72 loans to appreciative people in 39 countries. Repayments are proceeding well and according to predicted rates. We have a regular routine established which includes quarterly activity and reporting.

By Gender

Monarch has a focus on loaning predominantly to women who are often the sole person responsible for the family unit. Currently 68% of recipients are women. This also reflects Monarch's commitment to female empowerment.




By Country
